Earl G. Hager was born in Charlevoix county, Michigan, in 1885 and died of pneumonia at his home in Bellevue, March 26, 1909, being 23 years 10 months and 15 days old.

When he was two years of age his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Hager, moved to Vermontville township where he attended the Misner school until his parents moved to Vermontville. He attended the Vermontville school until he graduated in 1902 at the age of seventeen. Five years ago he went to Charleville with his parents where he was soon taken into the Bank as assistant cashier.

He came to Bellevue the first of last December where he assisted in the Hager, lumber and coal yard, until three weeks ago, when he went to Texas, where he was taken sick and started home arriving on Saturday previous to his death.

The funeral was held at the Congregational church Monday afternoon. Rev. Parsons officiating. Interment at Woodlawn.
