



This picture shows President Coolidge and Supt. Clifford G. Wade of the Superior (Wis.) schools, standing in front of the president's summer white house at Brule, near Superior. Supt. Wade, son of George H. Wade, a pioneer Carmel resident, and his high school students, paid President Coolidge and his staff a visit this summer and the President posed for a picture with Mr. Wade, a graduate of the Charlotte High school and well known in educational circles in both Michigan and Wisconsin. Behind the President and Mr. Wade are many students and several secret service men. Mrs. Coolidge was in the group but her picture doesn't show in this half-tone. Supt. Wade sent the picture to his long time friend, Wilson Geddes, who kindly loaned the picture to the Republican for the above cut. It is an excellent likeness of the President. Supt. Wade looks much the same, a trifle older in appearance, perhaps, than when he headed the school system in Flint, and was a frequent visitor to Charlotte.
