

# Dies at 86

Mr. Sober, 86, of 118 E. Hillsdale st., died Wednesday evening after an illness of seven years.

**DIES IN JEEP CRASH**—Lieut.-Gen. Walton H. Walker, noted commander of the U. S. 8th Army in Korea since last July, was fatally hurt when an army jeep in which he was riding to the front lines, crashed north of Seoul this morning. Still alive when taken from the wreckage, he was pronounced dead upon arrival at a field hospital. He had been recommended for a full generalship.



**NEW 8TH ARMY LEADER**—Lieut.-Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway has been appointed new commanding general of the U. S. 8th Army in Korea succeeding Lieut.-Gen. Walton H. Walker who was killed in a jeep accident, Gen. Douglas MacArthur's headquarters announced today. General Ridgway has been deputy chief of staff of the U. S. army. He formerly commanded the 82nd Airborne Division.
