**W. Glen Abbott, 77,  
 Passed On Saturday**

**Retired Business Man Conducted Variety Store Here 30 Years; Services Held Wednesday**

W. Glen Abbott, 77 years old, retired widely-known merchant of Charlotte, died Saturday evening at the residence, 139 South Oliver street. He had been in poor health for two years.

Mr. Abbott was born in 1873 at Reading, Hillsdale county, the son of James and Elizabeth Abbott. He was married May 16, 1901, to Miss Anna Norin.

He once conducted the Abbott House, earlier the property of and operated by his father in Howard City. He was a former county clerk of Montcalm county, serving in that position from 1910 to 1914. Then he came from Stanton to Charlotte and conducted a variety store here for 30 years, retiring from business in 1944.

Mr. Abbott was a member of the First Baptist church and chairman of the board of trustees for 18 years. He was a 32nd degree Mason and had been a member of the Maccabees for 50 years.

Surviving besides the widow, are nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at two o'clock at the Burkhead chapel. Rev. A. G. Hetherington officiated, assisted by Rev. R. J. Fields. Pallbearers were Fred Richey, John Pede, Calvin Newland, James Church, Carl Widrig and Warren Blight. Burial was in Maple Hill cemetery.
