Malone, Dies CULVER CITY, Calif.-(AP)-Dudley Field Malone, 68, internationally famed attorney, actor and one-time prominent Democrat, is dead.

suffering a hemorrhage Malone Wednesday.

Malone served as collector of the Port of New York during World War II. He was an assistant Secretary of State for seven months in 1913 during Woodrow Wilson's first term as President.

Among the causes he espoused were women's suffrage, repeal of prohibition and freedom for India. In the 1920's he achieved an international reputation with his handling of divorce cases in Paris. then the forerunner of Reno. His clients included Ganna Walska, Julius Fleischmann and W. K. Vanderbilt.

Malone was married and divorced three times. His son, Dudley Field (Shim) Malone, Jr., of London, survives.

In 1932 and 1936 he broke with the Democrats and Franklin Roosevelt-earlier his friend-by supporting Hoover and Alf M. Landon, the Republican nominees for President.
