Farm Couple Returning From Shopping Trip Are Victims

(Special to The State Journal) CHARLOTTE, Oct. 26 - A Vermontville township couple were killed instantly Wednesday morning when their car collided with a westbound New York Central train at the Bradley rd. crossing in Chester township.

The victims are C. B. Ray Baisel, 50, Vermontville farmer, and his wife, Addie, 52. Sheriff's officers said the couple were returning home from a shopping trip to Vermontville. The bodies were removed

According to initial incomplete reports of the mishap the driver had an unobstructed view of the

crossing.

The crash brought a large crowd of spectators and the train was delayed pending completion of the investigation by sheriff's officers. The train was en route from Jackson to Grand Rapids.

The bodies will remain at the chapel here pending completion of funeral arrangements. No immediate cause for the accident could be ascertained pending a further report by officers.
