Nashville — Shirley Potter, 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ellis Potter, died Monday night in Lelia hospital, Battle Creek, the first polio victim of this community. As a result, the Nashville-W. K. Kellogg agricultural school, where she was a junior, has been closed for the remainder of the week.

A sister, Connie, is a patient in the hospital, suffering from polio.

Shirley is survived by her parents, two sisters, Connie and Marjory, and a grandmother, Mrs. May Long of Battle Creek.

In addition to Connie Potter, there are two other local residents suffering from polio, Janet Randall and Mrs. William Swiger.
