Orlo Roush, 70, lifelong resident of Barry county, died Saturday morning in a Battle Creek hospital. Funeral services were conducted from the Leonard chapel in Hastings Tuesday afternoon, with the Rev. Leason Sharpe officiating and burial in Barryville cemetery.

Mr. Roush was born in Barry county July 4, 1879, the son of David and Maria (Frey) Roush, and had lived in the Barryville district the last 65 years. Beginning about 15 years ago, he created a beauty spot near his home which he opened to the public and which has become known as Roush's park. Thru the years thousands of people have picnicked there in the pleasant ravine thru which Highbank creek twists and tumbles, and improving and maintaining the park was one of Mr. Roush's greatest pleasures.
