sugar bush on her farm. Coroner M. D. Burkhead of Charlotte said death was apparently due to suicide. A discharged sin-gle-barrel shotgun was found bec side the body, which was partially n decomposed.

King had been missing since last Oct. 26, when he arrived at his brother's farm and went hunting alone. The body was discovered about 600 feet from the rear of the farm house, three miles south-east of Vermontville. elt

Apparently leaves had hidden the body from numerous searchers, including neighbors, Boy Scouts and an airplane which hunted for the missing man for three weeks last fall. wee

The body was taken to the Ward average funeral home in Vermontville Deag pending funeral arrangements. Mai L St.
