

Find Body Of Hunter

Harold King, Charlotte, Missing Since October; Called Suicide

VERMONTVILLE, March 12—
The body of Harold (Red) King,
49, of Charlotte, missing since a
hunting trip last October, was dis-
covered in a dry creek bed Thurs-
day morning.

Mrs. Fred King, sister-in-law of
the man, discovered the body as
she was checking sap pails in a
sugar bush on her farm.

Coroner M. D. Burkhead of
Charlotte said death was apparent-
ly due to suicide. A discharged sin-
gle-barrel shotgun was found be-
side the body, which was partially
decomposed.

King had been missing since last
Oct. 26, when he arrived at his
brother's farm and went hunting
alone. The body was discovered
about 600 feet from the rear of
the farm house, three miles south-
east of Vermontville.

Apparently leaves had hidden
the body from numerous searchers,
including neighbors, Boy Scouts
and an airplane which hunted for
the missing man for three weeks
last fall.

The body was taken to the Ward
funeral home in Vermontville
pending funeral arrangements.

Survivors include two daughters,
Rosalie and Linda, who reside with
their mother, Mrs. Kate King of
Charlotte; a sister, Mrs. Leo Bos-
worth of Sunfield; and two broth-
ers, Albert of Howell and Fred
of Vermontville.

Pomona Grange, and the Mich-
igan State Grange. He was a
Past Master of Charlotte Grange.

He and his wife took a great
interest in farm affairs, especially
the raising of sheep, having been
members of the Eaton Co. Sheep-
breeders Ass'n and the Michigan
Wool Growers Ass'n. He was a
kind father, a loyal and devoted
husband, and a good neighbor,

and will be greatly missed. Be-
sides the wife and son, he leaves
his father; two brothers, Royal, of
Lansing, and Bert, of Sunfield;
two sisters, Mrs. Victoria Ball, of
near Charlotte, and Mrs. Ruth
VanWey, of near Olivet. Inter-
