

Oldest Vet Dies at 111

Civil War Campaigner for North Succumbs in Rochester, N. Y.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., March 13 (AP)—James A. Hard, the nation's oldest Civil war veteran, died last night at 111 of complications that followed a leg amputation. His death left but one survivor of the Union army and four veterans of the Confederate forces. Hard, who fought in the Battle of Bull Run, Chancellorville, Antietam and Fredericksburg, died in Rochester general hospital at 11:45 p. m. (E. S. T.).



The lone survivor of the 2,675,000 men who wore the Union blue is Albert Woolson, 106, of Duluth, Minn.

Hard, whose recipe for longevity was "work hard, don't worry and smoke plenty of cigars," was the national junior vice commander-in-chief of the G. A. R.

Hard's first wife died in 1879, and his second in 1929. A daughter by his first wife died in 1948. Three grandchildren and several great-grandchildren survive.
