Death Takes Mother Of Joe Louis 2 22

Ex-Champ at Side As She Succumbs

Mrs. Lillie Barrow Brooks, 69, mother of Detroit's most famed boxing figure, Joe Louis, died at 7:30 p. m. Sun-

Her son, the former world's heavyweight champion, was at ZOH her bedside.

Mrs. Brooks had been suffering from a heart ailment for more than a year. In September, she was taken to Woman's Hospital in critical condition.

Apparently recovering, she had gone back to her home at 2100 McDougall, one of the first gifts from her son when

About a week ago, she went to stay with a daughter, Mrs. Employer, Davis, of 1508 McDougall. It was there she died.

BORN IN THE humblest of circumstances in Lafayette, Ala., Mrs. Brooks brought her large brood of children to Detroit in

The first years were hard years and the family had to accept welfare aid.

In 1935, however, Mrs. Brooks proudly handed back to the city a check for \$269, the amount of aid the family had received over 18 months.

A devoutly religious woman, she was also her famous son's stanchest rooter. Yet she avoided as far as possible attending any of his 25 defenses of his title.

"I JUST CAN"T stand to see Joe get hurt," she would say.

Surviving Mrs. Brooks besides Joe and Mrs. Davis are three other sons, Alvanus, Deleon and Lonnie Barrow, and three other daughters, Mrs. Susie Woodall, Mrs. Eulalie Barrow, and Mrs. Mrs. Eulalie Barrow, and Mrs. Sidney High.

There are also 34 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.
