

A warrant charging Owen Carvill, 21, of Manhattan, Kan., with manslaughter in the death of Leo W. Hoke here, was issued Thursday by Justice John C. Loucks on request of Assistant Prosecutor Henry J. Milanowski, who said Carvill told Kansas City, Kan., police he would waive extradition proceedings.

A young man and woman were arrested Wednesday night in Grand Rapids and an army sergeant was placed in custody at Kansas City, Kan., for questioning in the fatal assault Nov. 6 of Leo W. Hoke, 29, of 4461 Clyde Park av., SW, who died Wednesday afternoon at Blodgett Memorial hospital of head injuries.

Deputy Prosecutor Henry J. Milanowski, Wyoming Township Detective John VanderBand and County Deputy Richard Wiersma said Thursday the 23-year-old married woman and 18-year-old youth picked up here have admitted witnessing the scuffle in which Hoke was injured.

The sergeant, who is 21 and lives in Manhattan, Kan., was arrested by Kansas officers on the request of local authorities Wednesday night. He is alleged to have been the man who struck Hoke and knocked him to the ground in a scuffle on the parking lot of a Division av., S, bar at Home Acres.

Witnesses Aid Police.

Milanowski and the officers said the arrests were made through descriptions of the soldier and the 15-year-old local youth by Hoke and witnesses. The local arrests were made at a Leonard st., NW, bar, they reported. Both were being held Thursday at the Kent county jail.

Dr. G. A. Mulder conducted a post-mortem examination at the hospital late Wednesday afternoon to determine the exact cause of Hoke's death. Hoke had been transferred to Blodgett hospital late Tuesday night for emergency brain surgery after his condition unexpectedly became worse at Burton Heights Osteopathic hospital, members of Hoke's family said.

Under questioning Wednesday night, the local youth related he and the young woman and the soldier and the latter's wife had been drinking in the bar, where Hoke also was drinking. When the group stepped outside, he stated, the scuffle started but he could give no reason for the altercation, investigators reported.

7, at which time the injured man reported he had been assaulted by a man dressed in army clothing while another man held him.

Hoke's family said the incident happened between 8 and 8:30 p. m., Friday, Nov. 6, when he went to the parking lot to meet a friend to close a business deal. Hoke later told his wife, Florence,
