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C&O Tests New Freight Trucks With 80-Mile-Speed Objective

Freight cars that will roll across freight car "trucks," those fourthe country at 80 miles an hour-50 per cent faster than now-may result from experiments being conducted right here in Grand Rapids for benefit of all railroads.

The Chesapeake & Ohio railway, from its Wyoming yards here, every day is sending out an experimental train, powered by a sleek streamlined locomotive, to find out if it can speed up freight shipments.

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wheeled units under each end of a freight car, are working in cooperation with the C&O engineer-

ing office here.
Twice daily the experimental train makes a 96-mile round trip to Grand Ledge. Every day the test car rides on different trucks.

First trip of the day the car rides empty. On the first half of the second trip the car carries 48,000 pounds. On the last half, 88,000 pounds.

Every inch of both trips is carefully recorded by electrical instruments in an accompanying test

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
