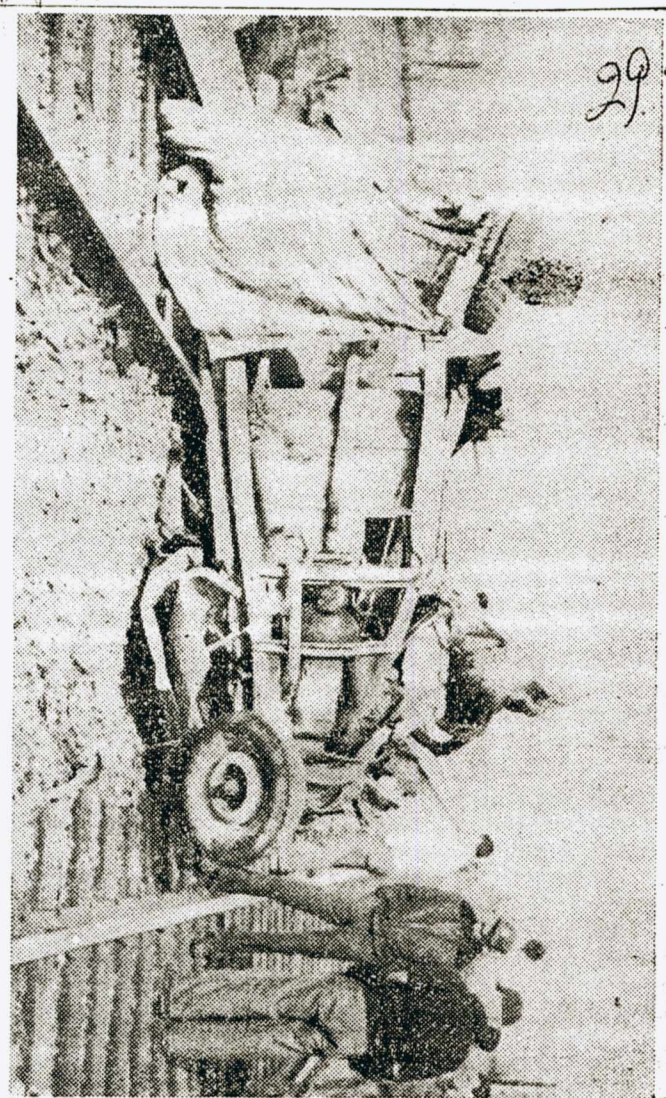


Car Runs Into Train; Woman Killed

Crash Fatal To Woman

Barry Driver Killed as Car Hits Train

Charlotte — Mrs. Flossie Lenon, 69, of Nashville R2, was killed late Friday afternoon when her car smashed into the side of the tender of Grand Trunk's eastbound passenger train No. 20.

The accident happened about a quarter mile west of Potterville and seven miles north of here, where the line's tracks cross a county road known as Vermontville highway. Eaton county sheriff's officer's reported. The woman's body was hurled

260 feet down the track. Her automobile, which was demolished, was dragged 210 feet.

Eaton county Coroner M. Donald Burkhead said death was caused by decapitation.

Officers said the crossing is clear although there is no signal. They said the woman apparently did not see the oncoming train.

Mrs. Lenon is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Lucille Bannister of Battle Creek, Mrs. Iva Carnell of Holt and Mrs. Violet Nash of Grand Ledge; a son, Karl Wirt of Bath; a sister, Mrs. Daisy Bentley of Millet and four brothers, Floyd and Murr Baisel of Millet, Fay and Dee of Charlotte; eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Funeral services will be held at 2 Monday in Otto funeral home. Burial will be in Delta Center near Lansing.
