Wreckage of B-29 Believed Found

LAS PALMAS, Canary Islands, Feb. 1 (AP)—A Spanish naval commander announced today the discovery of wreckage believed to be part of an American B-29 superfortress missing since Thursday. He said no survivors had yet been found.

The commander said he received a radio message from a Belgian ship reporting the wreckage was located just before midnight last night at a point half way between the Canaries and Gibraltar.

The Belgian message said a number of life preservers and some wreckage were picked up but no signs of either survivors or victims had been sighted.

The Superfort had been on a training flight from Dakar, French West Africa, to the U. S. training base at Marham, England. It carried 15 men.
