

Dead at 62

Dr. Stucky, director of the Eaton county health department for the past 13 years and director of the Ingham county tuberculosis sanatorium from 1921 to 1938, died at Hayes-Green-Beach Memorial hospital in Charlotte Monday evening. He was 62 years of age.

To Be Thursday

CHARLOTTE, Nov. 28.—Funeral services will be held Thursday at 2 p. m. from St. John's Episcopal church here for Dr. George C. Stucky, 62, Eaton county health director who died Monday.

Rt. Rev. Lewis Bliss Whittemore of Grand Rapids, bishop of the western Michigan Episcopal diocese, and Rev. Fr. Doan E. Rose of Charlotte will officiate at the rites for the former Lansing resident, who served as director of the Ingham County Tuberculosis sanatorium prior to assuming his Eaton county position. The body will be taken to Detroit for cremation.

Dr. Stucky, a former director of the National Tuberculosis association, was born May 10, 1888, in Louisville, Ky., the son of George and Imogene (Courtney) Stucky. He was married June 16, 1923, to Juliette Bartholomew, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Harry S. Bartholomew of Lansing, later of Harbor Beach.

The Eaton health director graduated from the University of Michigan medical school in 1923, and interned at Ford hospital, Detroit.

Dr. Stucky suffered a cerebral hemorrhage Sunday, the attack resulting in his death on the following day.

The family has asked that flowers be omitted and that funds which would have gone for that purpose be contributed to St. John's Episcopal church at Charlotte, of which Dr. Stucky was a warden.
