Mrs. Ora Lena Hokanson, 96, died Sunday in Kalama township, leaving 11 children, 38 grandchildren, 95 great-grandchildren, and 25 great-great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Hokanson, who had lived for the past 10 years at the home of a daughter, Mrs. Floyd Boyd of Kalama township, was born in Germany, Oct. 21, 1854, daughter of Carl and Fredericka (Brookman) Daniels, and came to this country when three months old.
