

### E. N. McGee Dies In Los Angeles

Was for Many Years a Well Known Resident of Charlotte, Had Been West for Several Years

Edwin N. McGee, for many years a well known Eaton county man, died suddenly in the office of F. E. Temple, 342 Walter P. Story Bldg., Los Angeles, Calif., while transacting business.

Mr. McGee had had two previous heart attacks, and collapsed with an unfinished sentence on his lips. "He was of genial nature and generous disposition" as a host of local friends will pleasantly recall. He was 54 years of age and at the time of his death, was associated with the firm of Chelew & Hoyt, real estate-brokers of Los Angeles.

He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, a member of the A. O. O. G. Temple, Arbor, Detroit. His family for the past few years have resided in Michigan.

His body was shipped to Jackson, Michigan, arriving Friday, March 14, and funeral services were held at his father's home in Spring Arbor, with burial in the family lot.
