325.133 Information furnished by informant. [M.S.A. 27.343]

Sec. 3. The furnishing of information by an authorized representative shall not subject any person or agency furnishing the information to any civil or criminal liability.

325.134 Violation, punishment.

Sec. 4. Any disclosure of information in violation of this act is punishable as such under the state health commission. The state health commission or any other person or agency furnishing any information in violation of this act shall be liable for the same as if it were a violation of the provisions of the act.

Approved May 17, 1963

AN ACT to amend sections 325.133 and 325.134 of the Public Act No. 99 of the Public Acts of 1963, entitled "An act to revise the jurisdiction of the courts of justice and other officers, judges and other officers, actions and proceedings in civil actions for the violation of certain provisions of the Public Act No. 99 of the Public Acts of 1963."

Section amended.

Section 1. Section 325.133 of the Public Acts of 1963, is hereby amended to read:

677.3 Constables' fees. [M.S.A. 27.343]

Sec. 3. Constables shall receive the following fees: For serving a warrant, \$1.00; for serving a summons, \$2.00; for a copy of every summons delivered on request, or left with the defendant, in his absence, 25 cents; For serving an attachment or writ of replevin, \$1.00; and for the inventory of the property seized, 50 cents; For serving a subpoena, 50 cents for service upon each witness; For serving an execution upon the body or goods and chattels of a party, \$1.00; For committing a defendant to prison on execution, \$1.00;
