resulting therefrom; the i tery. fire underneath to propel the same; firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, Roman candles, Daygo bombs or other fireworks of like construction, or any fireworks containing any explosive or inflammable compound or any tablets or other device commonly used and sold as fireworks containing nitrates, chlorates, oxalates, sulphides of lead, barium, antimony, arsenic, mercury, nitroglycerine, phosphorous or any compound containing any of the same or other modern explosives, except toy pistol paper caps which contain 1/4 grain, or less, of explosive mixture, and except sparklers containing not more than .0125 pounds of burning portions per sparkler, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor: Provided, That the council or commission of any city or village or the township board of any township may, upon application in writing, grant a permit for the use of fireworks manufactured for out-door pest control, agricultural purposes, or for public display of fireworks by municipalities, fair associations, amusement parks or other organizations or groups of individuals approved by such city, village or township authorities, when handled by a competent operator. After such permit shall have been granted, sales, possession or
