Crash Kills Marshall Speeder

Driver Ticketed Less Than Hour Before Fatal Accident

Police ticketed a Marshall man for speeding Sunday less than an hour before his car ran out of control, killing him and his brother-in-law.

The victims were among ten persons who died in Michigan highway accidents during the weekend. The Associated Press reports the weekend fatalities all for the period from 6 p.m. Friday until midnight Sunday.

Esequiel Almaraz, 23, and his brother-in-law, Robert L. Bradley, 19, also of Marshall, died when their vehicle hit a tree near Marshall. Sheriff's men said Almaraz was ticketed for speeding 65 in a 25 miles-per-hour zone in Bedford Township near Battle Creek an hour before the crash.

Marshall Crash Kills 2 Sunday

MARSHALL — Calhoun County's 1966 highway traffic toll was raised to 11 when two men were killed at the Bear Creek curve on old U.S. 12 (Michigan Ave.) a mile west of the city Sunday at 2:35 a.m.

Killed were Esequiel Almaraz, 23, and Robert L. Bradley, 19, both of Marshall.

A third occupant of the vehicle, which went off the left side of the highway at a high rate of speed and hit a tree, was taken to a Battle Creek hospital in critical condition. He is Ronald McCum, 23, Marshall, who suffered fractures of both legs, internal and head injuries. It took an hour to extract the trio from the wreckage, officers said.
