

Past Nashville Businessman Buried Saturday

Services for Ray I. Thompson, 70, were held Saturday at 2 p.m. at the Vogt Funeral Home in Nashville.

Mr. Thompson, former businessman, died Wednesday, June 29, at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Battle Creek where he had been a patient 16 years.

From 1934 to 1950 Mr. Thompson owned and operated a grocery store, moving to Nashville from Chester. For a time Mrs. Thompson operated the Chester store and he the Nashville store.

A former president of the Nashville Lions Club, Mr. Thompson served two years on the Nashville Village Council, was a member of the Masonic Order, chairman of the Youth Council, World War I veteran serving overseas, and a member of the Nashville Methodist Church.

He was born at Tufon, a son of Andrew and Julia (Schuck) Thompson, on Nov. 23, 1895. On Sept. 10, 1919, he was married in Charlotte to Beulah Haigh.

Survivors include his wife, who resides at 201 Phillips Street; two daughters, Mrs. Victor (Elaine) Higdon of Nashville and Mrs. Victor (Janice) Walton of Bellaire, Md.; three grandchildren; one great grandchild; two sisters, Mrs. Bertha Brody of LeRoy and Mrs. Sadie Bonham of McBaine, and three brothers, Lee of Riverside, Calif., Glenn of Yuma, Colo., and Joy of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

The Rev. Max Gladding officiated at Saturday's services, and burial was in Lakeview Cemetery.
