Woman, 83, Killed in Car Crash

LAKE ODESSA—A rural Lake Odessa woman was killed and her husband injured in a two-car collision Tuesday afternoon in front of Lakewood High School near here.

Dead was Mrs. Grace Rogers, 83, a passenger in the car driven by her husband, John, 84. State Police said he was taken to nearby Pennock Hospital, Hastings.

Driver of the other car, Edward Schlak, 71, of R. 2, Lansing, was uninjured, State Police said.

The accident occurred at 3:10 p.m. on M-50 at Velte Road, three miles east of Lake Odessa.

State troopers are investigating.

Mrs. Rogers was a lifelong resident of this area.
