

Pioneer Resident Dies at 91

Services were held Saturday at Skinner Chapel for Mrs. Leora H. Conant, 91, who died at a Charlotte nursing home Wednesday, Nov. 29. Burial was in Rose Hill cemetery.

Mrs. Conant had been a lifelong resident of Eaton Rapids and made her home at 1018 S. Main St., the home built by her father and mother, Oren and Mary Rose, in 1868.

She was born here Jan. 28, 1876, graduated from high school and taught school in the lower grades here before going on to Cleary college at Ypsilanti. She then taught at Ionia Reformatory for some time where she met and married Ed Ewing in 1912. Mr. Ewing, who worked with prisoners there, was transferred to Jackson where they lived until they returned to live in Eaton Rapids to care for her aging mother. Ewing died in 1927, and she later married Frank Conant. Mr. Conant died in 1937. Mrs. Conant entered a nursing home here in 1957, later transferring to Charlotte.

Survivors include two nieces, Mrs. Marion Church of Battle Creek and Miss Ruby Patterson of Vermontville.
