Killed Thursday**

VERMONTVILLE—Mrs. Jean Mary Carter, 46, of 177 Fourth St., Vermontville, was killed about 3:20 p.m. Thursday when her car collided with another vehicle on State Road just east of M-46.

Barry County sheriff's officers said Mrs. Carter's car collided head-on with a car driven by Wayne Lydy, 22, of 401 Harriet, Lansing. Lydy suffered severe cuts and bruises and a crushed elbow. He is at Pennock Hospital, Hastings.

Deputies said Mrs. Carter was passing a farm tractor and wagon when the collision occurred.

They said she was on her way to work at the Hastings Manufacturing Company.

Surviving Mrs. Carter are two sons, Alan Hamlin of Kalamazoo and Randy Hamlin at home; a grandson; three brothers, Dale Raffer of Pontiac and Earl and Floyd Raffer of Arizona.
