Carelessness Claimed The prosecutor said that his 24hour investigation of the accident had convinced him of carelessness on the part of Swift, whose autopath of a fast Michigan Central passenger train with the result that all four occupants of the other car were instantly killed and the train wrecked, crushing the life out of an unidentified transient riding on the locomotive tender.
