OBITUARY

Mary Chatfield Wells was born in Oneida county in the state of New York, Oct. 26th, 1822. With her father's family she came to this state in January, 1839, locating in the township of Sunfield, Eaton county. October 20th, 1841, she was married to Wm. A. Wells and with him moved onto their farm on Sec. 33 of the township of Sunfield where she resided until the time of her death, March 21st, of the present year. At the time of her death Mrs. Wells was 74 years of age and had lived with her husband, who survives her, 54 years. She was the mother of six children five of whom with twenty grandchildren and five great-grand-children survive her.

Mrs. Wells was one of the first white women to make her home in the township of Sunfield and has lived to see an unbroken wilderness transformed into fruitful fields, and log shanties and bark covered cabins, devoid of everything but the barest necessities, replaced by homes of comfort and luxury. There is much that might be said in praise of her life, but it is written too indelibly in the hearts of those who shared with her the privations and the toils of pioneer days to require any lengthy recital here.

We knew and loved her as a faithful and helpful wife, a wise and loving mother, a neighbor whose feet were never too weary to go on errands of mercy to those who were in need of helpful ministrations and as one whose
