Death Finally Cheats Rescuers

Mrs. Anna Dyer died Saturday in the arms of the men who had saved her life 170 times since 1952.

The 88-year-old woman, who lived at 1020 E. Saginaw St., had suffered from hardening of the arteries.

She had repeated attacks of dizziness in 11 years, but the Lansing Fire Department inhalator squad had always revived her.

Mrs. Dyer suffered another attack Saturday afternoon and the inhalator squad sped to her familiar address.

When the squad arrived, Mrs. Dyer was sitting in a chair. She was having difficulty breathing



and life saving oxygen was administered.

After 20 minutes, firemen reported, the woman seemed to be doing OK. Then she stopped breathing. The inhalator squad tried again, but couldn't revive her.

Mrs. Dyer came close to setting an all-time record for inhalator runs, firemen said.

The record was held by the late Harry Cove of 219 N. Foster Ave., who died at 96 in 1955 after being revived 173 times.

Mrs. Dyer was a life-time resident of Lansing and DeWitt. She is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Christine Deatsman of Lansing; one grandchild, and a brother, Frank Rohrer of DeWitt.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Gorsline-Runciman Funeral Home with burial in DeWitt Cemetery.
