**Williams' Mother Dies at 80**

DETROIT (AP)—Mrs. Henry P. Williams, mother of former Gov. G. Mennen Williams and an heiress to the Mennen toilettries fortune, died today at a Detroit hospital. She was 80.

The former Elma C. Mennen died at 5 a.m. She had entered Jennings Memorial Hospital Oct. 23.

Her son, the former six-time governor who now is assistant secretary of state for African affairs, was at her bedside.

There also are two other sons, Richard E., executive of a marine engines manufacturing firm in Detroit, and Henry P. Jr., a rancher at Glenwood Springs, Colo.

Mrs. Williams' husband died in 1941.

Although an avowed Republican, Mrs. Williams was an outspoken supporter of her Democratic son, who won the Michigan governorship more times than any man in the history of the state. He served from 1949 to 1961 and retired unbeaten.

Mrs. Williams, a native of Newark, N. J., lived in fashionable, suburban Grosse Pointe Farms. Her father was a founder of the Mennen Co., of Newark.
