32.427 Repeal. [M.S.A.] DIMONDALE — Calvin P. Hammond, 72, of 6445 Canal Road, R. 1, Dimondale, a former Windsor Township official and a retired Detroit Packing Co. officer, died of a heart attack while in Charlotte Thursday.

Mrs. Hammond's mother died Thursday in Springport and he was making plans to attend the funeral, friends said, when he collapsed and died.

A native of Springport, he had lived in the Dimondale area for 40 years. He was a former Windsor Township trustee and formerly was vice president of the Detroit Packing Co. He was a member of the Farm Bureau.
