Aged Eaton Woman Succumbs to Burns

Mrs. Victoria J. Ball, 85, of 1143 E. Broadway Hwy., Eaton township, seriously burned in a fire last Tuesday afternoon at her home, died at 11 p.m. Thursday in St. Lawrence hospital, Lansing.

Mrs. Ball, who lived alone, was burned when her heating stove overheated and her clothing caught fire.

Mrs. Ball was born December 20, 1881 in York township, Fulton county, Ohio, daughter of John and Estella (Boyer) Creitz. She had been a resident of Eaton county for 78 years. She was the widow of Jessie F. Ball, a farmer who died in 1940.
