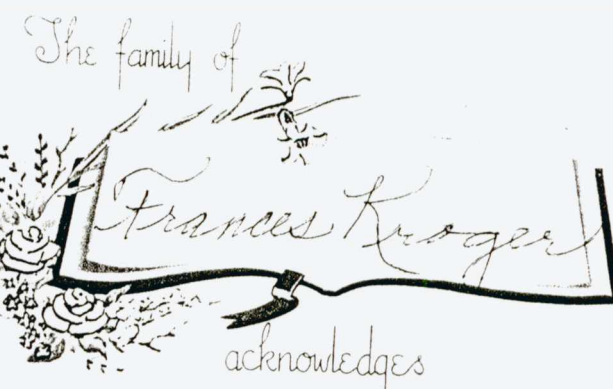


Vern Rawson
