Following a lengthy period of ill health, William H. Hawkins, for many years actively connected with the lumber industry in this district, died Sunday in a local hospital in his 74th year.

A timber scaler, Mr. Hawkins had worked for different lumber companies and was for a time connected with the local office of the Department of Lands and Forests.

He was born in Pembroke in 1875, a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry Hawkins, and was well known in the town and throughout the district.

He was unmarried and is survived by two sisters, Mrs. G. B. Tanner, Brockville, and Mrs. R. J. McGaughey, Pembroke, Mass. A niece, Mrs. Ernest Turnbull, lives in Louisville, Ky., and there are two nephews, B. H. Tanner, Toronto, and Urban Tanner, Brockville.

The body is resting at the funeral home of Malcolm & Deavitt, 141 Renfrew st., where the funeral service will be held at 2 p.m., Tuesday, Reverend J. L. Bradley of Micksburg officiating, with burial in Holy Trinity cemetery.
