### Burt Creitz

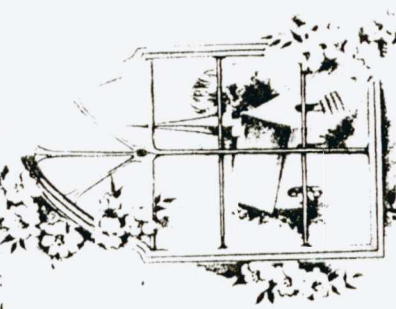
