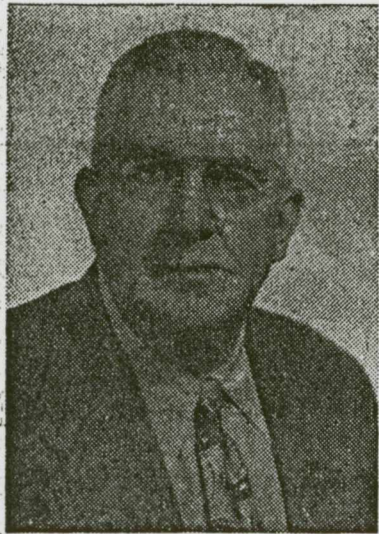


Funeral Services For Former Postmaster To Be Held Monday



Michael A. Mahar, former Vermontville postmaster, passed away Thursday morning at the Hastings hospital where he had been admitted the day before. He had been in failing health for the past year.

Mr. Mahar received his appointment as postmaster in 1935, a post he held until 1949 when he transferred to rural carrier on route 2. Due to ill health he was forced to retire in January 1959. After graduating from Vermontville high school, he was employed by Mr. Hammond in the Jewelry store. He went back to farming and later moved to Hastings where he spent ten years in the automobile business.

Mr. Mahar was born October 7, 1889 in Vermontville, the son of Michael and Margaret Shellenbarger Mahar. April 19, 1933 he married Nellie Moyer of Hastings. He was a member of the St Cyril church at Nashville, the Holy Name Society, and was a past president

of the Vermontville Lions club.

Surviving besides the wife is four sons, Bernard of Stafford, Kansas; Robert, Thomas and Joseph of Vermontville; two daughters, Mrs. Kermit (Martha) Stamm of Hastings, and Mrs. Walter (Magdolen) Joppie of Woodland; 20 grandchildren and 5 great grandchildren.
