

Friedland Rites Held

Prominent Woman Had Been Resident Here For 60 Years

Funeral services were held Thursday at 1:30 p. m. from the Estes-Leadley Colonial chapel for Mrs. Bessie E. Friedland, 71, of 1641 Sunnyside ave., who died Wednesday, May 18 at a local hospital. Rabbi Philip Frankel of Congregation Shaarey Zedek officiated and interment was made at Evergreen cemetery.

Mrs. Friedland had been a resident of Lansing for the past 60 years and was the widow of the late David Friedland.

R-T Publisher Dies at 73, the Victim of Heart Attack Sunday

Earl M. McGrath, 73, publisher of the Charlotte Republican-Tribune, passed away at 10:00 a. m. Sunday, May 15, 1960; at his home at 115 N. Oliver st., a victim of a heart attack. He had just returned to Charlotte from a Florida vacation four days earlier.

Mr. McGrath was born in Charlotte on March 18, 1887, the son of Harry T. and Ella (Jackson) McGrath and he spent his entire lifetime, with the exception of 11 years, in the city.

Following his graduation from Michigan Agricultural College in 1909, he taught school in Quincy, Ill., and Butte and Helena, Mont., before returning to Charlotte.

In 1921, he joined his father, Harry T. McGrath, and Murl H. DeFoe in publishing the Charlotte Republican. At that time Charlotte and Eaton county were served by three papers, the Republican, Tribune and Leader.
