## **R-T Publisher Dies** at 73, the Victim of **Heart Attack Sunday**

Earl M. McGrath, 73, publisher of the Charlotte Republican-Tribune, passed away at 10:00 a. m. Sunday, May 15, 1960, at his home at 115 N. Oliver st., a victim of a heart attack. He had just returned to Charlotte from a Florida vacation four days earlier.

Mr. McGrath was born in Charlotte on March 18, 1887, the son of Harry T. and Ella (Jackson) McGrath and he spent his entire lifetime, with the exception of 11 years, in the city.

Following his graduation from Michigan Agricultural College in 1909, he taught school in Quincy, III and Butte and Helena; Mont., before returning to Char-
