According to Beryl Field of Dimondale, Eaton county coroner, Mr. Link shot himself in the head with a 12-gauge shotgung Field quoted Link's brother, Gailen, who also lived at the farm home, as saying his brother had been despondent. Mr. Link was an army veteran

of World War II. He had served in the military police. Surviving are four brothers, Gailen, Andrew of Nashville, Don of R. 2, Charlotte, and Wil liam of R. 2, Vermontville; fw sisters, Mrs. Mabell Fuller of 2, Olivet, and Mrs. Emma B of Bellevue, and his mother, M Clemetta Link of Bellevue.
