# Free Methodist Clergyman Dies

GRAND LEDGE, Aug. 15—Funeral services will be held for Rev. H. Allen DeLong, 73, at 2 p. m. Tuesday at the Holihan funeral home, Grand Ledge.

Rev. DeLong had been a minister in the Free Methodist church since the age of 25. He died Saturday after suffering a heart attack while visiting in Spring Arbor.
