He was elected to the village council in 1934, and four years later was elected clerk, a position he held until 1955.

He is survived by his wife, Florence ,to whom he was married in 1931; a stepson, Claude Jurgensen of Grosse Pointe: two brothers, Norman and James of London, Ontario.
