Nashville Grocer 55 Years Is Dead

NASHVILLE—Colin T. Munro, 84, Nashville's oldest business man in years of service, died at 5 p.m. Tuesday at the Harlon Mason home where he had been staying since suffering a fall two weeks ago.

A former council member and village clerk for 17 years, Mr. Munro owned and operated a grocery store here for nearly 55 years. A Canadian by birth, he graduated from the London Collegiate Institute of London, Ontario, and taught school five years in Alpena County before enrolling at Ferris Institute. He was employed in the statistical department of the Chicago Edison Company and later served as private secretary to the county treasurer.

Mr. Munro purchased the Nashville Grocery in 1905, and had been continuously located in this building since that time. He was a life member of Nashville Lodge No. 255, F&AM, Zion Chapter No. 171, RAM, Hastings Commandry No. 56, Knights Templar, Laurel Chapter No. 31, OES, the now inactive IOOF and a member of the Nashville Methodist Church.

He was elected to the village council in 1934, and four years later was elected clerk, a position he held until 1955.

He is survived by his wife, Florence, to whom he was married in 1931; a stepson, Claude Jurgensen of Grosse Pointe; two brothers, Norman and James of London, Ontario.

The body is at the Vogt Funeral Home where funeral arrangements are pending.
