

**Robert Irvin Briggs**

Robert Irvin Briggs was born May 27, 1872, the youngest of the eight children of Abel and Henrietta Briggs. One of the Pioneer families of Eaton County. He was born on the farm in Kalamo Township where his parents settled in 1848. And he lived there for 88 years. On June 5, 1906, he was married to Zoe Vernon of Fountain Head, Tennessee. They had two daughters, Elinor and Helen. Irvin loved his home and was eager to try new ideas and methods of farming. He was one of the first in the county to have a herd of dairy cattle, one of the first to own a car, and one of the first to mechanize his farm. Zoe preceded Irvin in death in February 1930. Elinor died in March 1956. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Hadley Abernathy of Evanston, Illinois; many nieces, nephews, and friends to mourn his passing.

Services were held Thursday, Nov. 17, 1960 at the Pray Funeral Home, Charlotte, Michigan, Rev. Marvin Potter officiating. The Pallbearers were Ralph Wells, Walter Vernon, Edward Foote, Harold and Robert Gusey, and Dewayne Wright. Interment was in the family lot in Kalamo cemetery.
