

## LEROY HUMMEL DIES OF INJURIES RECEIVED IN SWIMMING ACCIDENT



LeRoy Hummel 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. LeRoy Hummel of R. 1 Vermontville died early Thursday morning from injuries received in a swimming accident Sunday night.

LeRoy was attending a Youth Fellowship party with a group of young folks from the Vermontville, Bismark and Gresham Methodist churches at the Floyd Halsey farm located on Gresham highway, just East of M-50. A few of the boys decided to go for a swim and when LeRoy failed to come up after diving, Mike Hulbert also with the group, jumped in and pulled him to shore. He was taken to Hayes Green Beach hospital in Charlotte. The accident occurred about 10 p. m.

LeRoy was born Nov. 29, 1936 in Pontiac, Michigan, the oldest son of Esther (Hallead) and LeRoy Hummel. He attended school
