Clubwoman Dies at 82

Mrs. Leuella Mumford Was Long Active in Civic Circles

Mrs. Leuella Mumford, 82, a former president of the Michigan State Federation of Women's Clubs and long active in civic and business circles here, died Sunday at a local hospital.

She had been a resident of East Lansing for many years, coming there from Chicago where she had been a teacher in the public schools. Mrs. Mumford was active in the Y. W. C. A. and was Michigan educational director for the U. S. food and drug administration during World War I. She was associated for a while with the Edward G. Hacker company and later with the Maurice B. Allen company. She studied law under Judge Meland W. Carr, now a supreme court justice.

Mrs. Mumford was president of the East Lansing Women's club from 1922 to 1924 and was president of the state federation from 1928 to 1930. She was a member of the Women's society of the Peoples church, the Greater Lansing Rose society and the American Rose society.

She resided at 710 Chittenden dr., East Lansing.

Survivors include a brother, Burr A. Horn of Pittsburgh, Pa., a sister, Miss Mary J. Horn of Gary, Ind., four nieces and a nephew.

Services will be held Thursday at 2:30 p. m. at the Estes-Leadley Colonial chapel with burial in Maple Grove cemetery, Mason.
