She was hospitalized at Cadillac 3½ years ago after suffering a stroke while visiting a cousin, Mrs. Mildred Nyquist of Manton.

After moving to Dimondale from Delta township, Mrs. Towar continued to maintain a deep interest in the affairs of the Delta Center Methodist church. She was recognized for her support of a number of Methodist philanthropic institutions.

She gave \$10,000 to the new Hayes-Green-Beach hospital during its building campaign in the name of her late brother, Lewis J. Dann. A Charlotte attorney and former Eaton county probate judge, he died in 1943.
