Mrs. Nelson Brown Dies At University Hospital

A week ago Tuesday Mrs. Nelson D. (Maxine) Brown, 60, was taken sick. Two days later she went to University hospital, Ann Arbor. Tuesday of this week she was struck by a cerebral hemorrhage. Five hours later she was dead.

Mrs. Brown was born in Leslie May 20, 1900, daughter of Ray and Kathryn Covert Ludwick. She was graduated from Leslie high school in 1918 and for a year attended a business college in Cleveland. She and Nelson Brown were married in 1921. After a few months in Leslie they made their home in Mason, for the past 35 years at 511 S. Lansing street.

She was a member of Mason Presbyterian church and of Mason General Hospital Auxiliary (Pink Ladies).

Two years ago Mrs. Brown underwent surgery for cancer. For a year she had been under treatment through the outpatient department at University hospital. She continued her household duties up until a week before her death.

Besides the husband, there are 2 sons and 2 daughters, Richard W. Brown and James N. Brown of Mason; and Mrs. George (Caroline) Bauer of Onaway, and Margaret Brown, a Mason high
