

George Hall Dies On Fishing Trip

George C. Hall 63, retired contractor, former council member and Justice of the Peace, died suddenly late Monday afternoon of a heart attack while on a fishing trip to Higgins Lake. He had accompanied John Hokanson and Ed Williams on the northern trip.

Mr Hall served on the Village Council from 1940 to 1946 and had been Justice of the Peace since 1948. He was born August 26, 1897 in Wood Co. Ohio, the son of William F. and Mary Ellen Fox. In December 1923 he married Thelma Strait at Vermontville. He served in world war I, and was a member of the American Legion Post 222 and the Masonic Lodge 232 F & AM.

Surviving besides the wife, Thelma are two daughters, Mrs Hugh (Priscilla) Hulse of Charlotte and Mrs Donald (Molly) Mitchell of Ogdensburg, New York; one son George W. of Caro; two brothers, Meril of Charlotte and Curtis of West Millgrove, Ohio and one sister, Mrs Leota Peters of Fostoria, Ohio and nine grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Thursday from the Methodist church with Rev. Howard Lindsay and Rev. Luren Strait of Romeo officiating. Burial was in Woodlawn cemetery.
