Ellen Louise Dwight Pennington was born January 8, 1867 in Vermontville, Michigan, the younger daughter of George C. Dwight and Margaret Gregg Dwight. Her older sister, Mrs. Walter E. Davis, lived in Vermontville until her death in 1945.

Mrs. Pennington attended district school in Vermontville township, high school in Vermontville village, and Charlotte High School. In 1889 she married John E. Pennington and after a year's residence in Eagle, Nebraska, she and her husband returned to Charlotte and made this city their permanent home.

She joined the O.E.S. in 1911, was worthy matron 1919-1920, and an honorary member of Maple City Chapter No. 218 and the Past Matrons' Club at the time of her death. She had also been a member of the Charlotte Woman's Club in earlier years.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Herbert H. Cole of, Washington, D.C. and Mrs. Royal B. Mudge of Sarasota, Florida, and a granddaughter, Miss Margaret of Sarasota, Mudge Florida.

Her courage, cheerfulness and thought of others when in constant pain herself helped many over a bad place, making them stronger because of her influence.
