Oliver E. McLaughlin, 80, for 31 years publisher of the weekly Vermontville Echo, died Satur-day, March 3, 1962, in the hospi-tal at Charlotte. He had been hospitalized a week.

A native of Eaton county, Mr. McLaughlin worked in Detroit as a tool maker and engraver before returning to Vermontville to buy the Echo in 1917. He sold the newspaper in 1948.
